LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

May 11, 2022

Redistricting remains a major issue for the state. With the involvement of the Ohio Supreme Court, redistricting is a "hot button" issue. Also on the agenda: gun issues, reproductive rights issues, freedom of speech issues, and, of course, CRT!

STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION: Former State Board of Education Vice President Steve Dackin is the pick for the top role at the Department of Education.

The BOE on Tuesday voted 14-4 with one abstention to appoint Mr. Dackin as the state superintendent of public instruction.

Mr. Dackin, who most recently served as Columbus State Community College's superintendent of school and community partnerships, succeeds former State Superintendent Paolo DeMaria, who retired last September.

House Bill 616

Though the Ohio Statehouse in on break until the week of May 9th, Honesty for Education and its partners are continuing the fight against HB 616.

HB 616 is Ohio's third educational gag order that censors honest education and discussion about race, racism, sexual orientation, and gender identity.

Taking its cues from HB 322, HB 327, Florida's "Don't Say Gay" bill, and other copycat bills across the country, HB 616 prohibits the teaching of sexual orientation and gender identity, Critical Race

Changes Likely For Preschool Special Education Rule

A regulation outlining requirements for preschool classrooms serving students with special needs is in line for revisions in response to concerns from school administrators throughout the state.

Wendy Grove, director of the Department of Education's Office of Early Learning and School Readiness, told the <u>State Board of Education</u> Tracked on Monday that an updated version of the <u>rule</u> likely will be posted later this month ahead of a hearing by the BOE's Integrated Student Supports Committee in June.

Ms. Grove said many concerns about the existing rule relate to its definition of an integrated preschool classroom as one in which 50% of children have disabilities and

50% do not. She said the rule does not account for the fluidity common in preschool enrollments across the state.
