

#### LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

July 15, 2020

The business of the legislature has been interrupted by both the novel corona virus and the civic unrest of last few weeks. The normal schedule of consideration of bills has been interrupted by special legislation proposed to meet the various crises that face us.

The House is working from home (see below). The Senate is finishing up work prior to the summer recess.

- 1. Education Institutions Among Recipients Of Next Round Of Aid Dollars: The DeWine Administration is looking to allocate a few hundred million more dollars in federal aid to schools and state agencies as they continue to respond to the novel coronavirus pandemic. The agenda for next week's Controlling Board includes money for K-12 schools and institutions of higher education, principally coming from the federal CARES Act. Gov. Mike DeWine on Thursday said he is asking the board to authorize \$300 million in federal funding for educational institutions to adopt COVID-19 best practices.

- 4. House Returns To Work-From-Home Mode After Staffer Tests Positive: Speaker Larry Householder has instructed all House members and staff to resume working from home after a Republican staffer tested positive for the novel coronavirus.
- 5. Referred to Education in Senate: HB 436 DYSLEXIA (Baldridge, B.) With regard to screening and intervention for children with dyslexia.
- 6. INTRODUCED in HOUSE: HB 708 EMERGENCY PLANS (MILLER, A.) To revise the law regarding emergency management plans and school safety drills and to declare an emergency.
- 7. Teacher Unions Oppose School Reopening Measure. Legislation that would give local officials the final say on when and how to reopen school buildings emerged from a committee hearing without any solid champions Wednesday. The Ohio Education Association and Ohio Federation of Teachers opposed the measure (SB 320) outright in testimony before the Senate Education Committee,

while groups representing school boards and superintendents detailed concerns with the bill in interested party testimony.

- 8. Senate Committee Hearings Education
  - a. HB 123 SCHOOL SECURITY (Holmes, G., Manning, G.) With regard to school security and youth suicide awareness education and training. CONTINUED-AMENDED (6th Hearing-All testimony-Possible amendments)
  - b. The committee accepted an amendment Chair Sen. Peggy Lehner (R-Kettering) id would permit districts and schools to establish student-led violence-prevention clubs rather than require them to do so.
  - c. The panel also began discussing an amendment put forward by Sen. Andy Brenner (R-Powell) that would establish a new, temporary funding formula for students in grades 8-12 in online charter schools in which a majority of students were enrolled in dropout prevention and recovery programs. He said the change was needed to drive additional funding to such schools to prevent permanent closures in the wake of the coronavirus pandemic.
  - d. Sen. Vernon Sykes (D-Akron) said he would like to see a change to the language so the formula only applies to online charter schools sponsored by traditional districts or educational service centers.
  - e. While she initially announced plans for committee members to caucus on Sen. Brenner's proposal Wednesday evening, Sen. Lehner ultimately asked legislators to send their concerns on the amendment to her ahead of next week's meeting.
  - f. SB 320 EDUCATION LAWS (Huffman, M.) To require public and private schools to decide whether to be open for instruction in the 2020-2021 school year, to permit parents providing home instruction to determine whether a building in which they provide instruction has adequate safety measures to address COVID-19, to prohibit other public officials from closing schools in that school year, and to declare an emergency. CONTINUED (See separate story) (2nd Hearing-All testimony)
- PASSED in SENATE: SB 288. RELIGIOUS EXPRESSION (GAVARONE, T.)
  Regarding student religious expression in interscholastic athletics and
  extracurricular activities (31-0)
- 10. SENATE CONCURS IN HOUSE AMENDMENTS: SB 4 (Enacted) CAPITAL APPROPRIATIONS (RULLI, M., KUNZE, S.) To apply the Prevailing Wage Law to transportation improvement district projects under certain circumstances, to temporarily expand the use of certain tax increment financing payments, to exempt personal protective equipment from certain political subdivision competitive bidding law during the period of the emergency declared by



Executive Order 2020-01D, issued on March 9, 2020, and to make capital appropriations to the Facilities Construction Commission and the Public Works Commission for the biennium ending June 30, 2022. 21-10

11. Referred to Education: SB 330 SCHOOL FUNDING (BRENNER, A.) To establish a new method of school financing for internet- and computer-based community schools in which a majority of the students are enrolled in a dropout prevention and recovery program.

#### 12. House Consideration:

- a. House Bill 684 (Hood, Brinkman) Academic Content to revise the law with regard to the state academic content standards and primary and secondary education assessments and teacher evaluations, to create the Legislative Office of Education Oversight, and to make other changes regarding the operation of primary and secondary schools.
- b. House Bill 693 (Swearingen, Manning) School Openings to prohibit, for the 2020-2021 school year only, public and chartered nonpublic schools from opening for instruction prior to the Wednesday after Labor Day and to declare an emergency.
- c. House Concurrent Resolution 31 (Howse, Crawley) Racism to declare racism a public health crisis and to ask the Governor to establish a working group to promote racial equity in Ohio.
- 13. HB 164 (Enacted) EDUCATION LAWS (GINTER, T.) Regarding student religious expression, regarding retention under the Third Grade Reading Guarantee for the 2020-2021 school year, to make changes to education law for the 2020-2021 school year in response to implications of COVID-19, to require the Department of Education to make an additional payment in fiscal year 2020 or 2021 to certain city, local, exempted village, and joint vocational school districts that experience a decrease in the taxable value of the district's utility tangible personal property and have at least one power plant in their territories, to permit a person to serve on more than five community school governing authorities under certain conditions, to extend until November 30, 2022, the moratorium on the building code requirement for storm shelters for school construction projects, to make changes regarding the Quality Community School Support Program, to provide an additional payment for fiscal year 2020 to school districts that experience a specified reduction in funding, to entitle the act the "Ohio Student Religious Liberties Act of 2019," to make an appropriation, and to declare an emergency.
